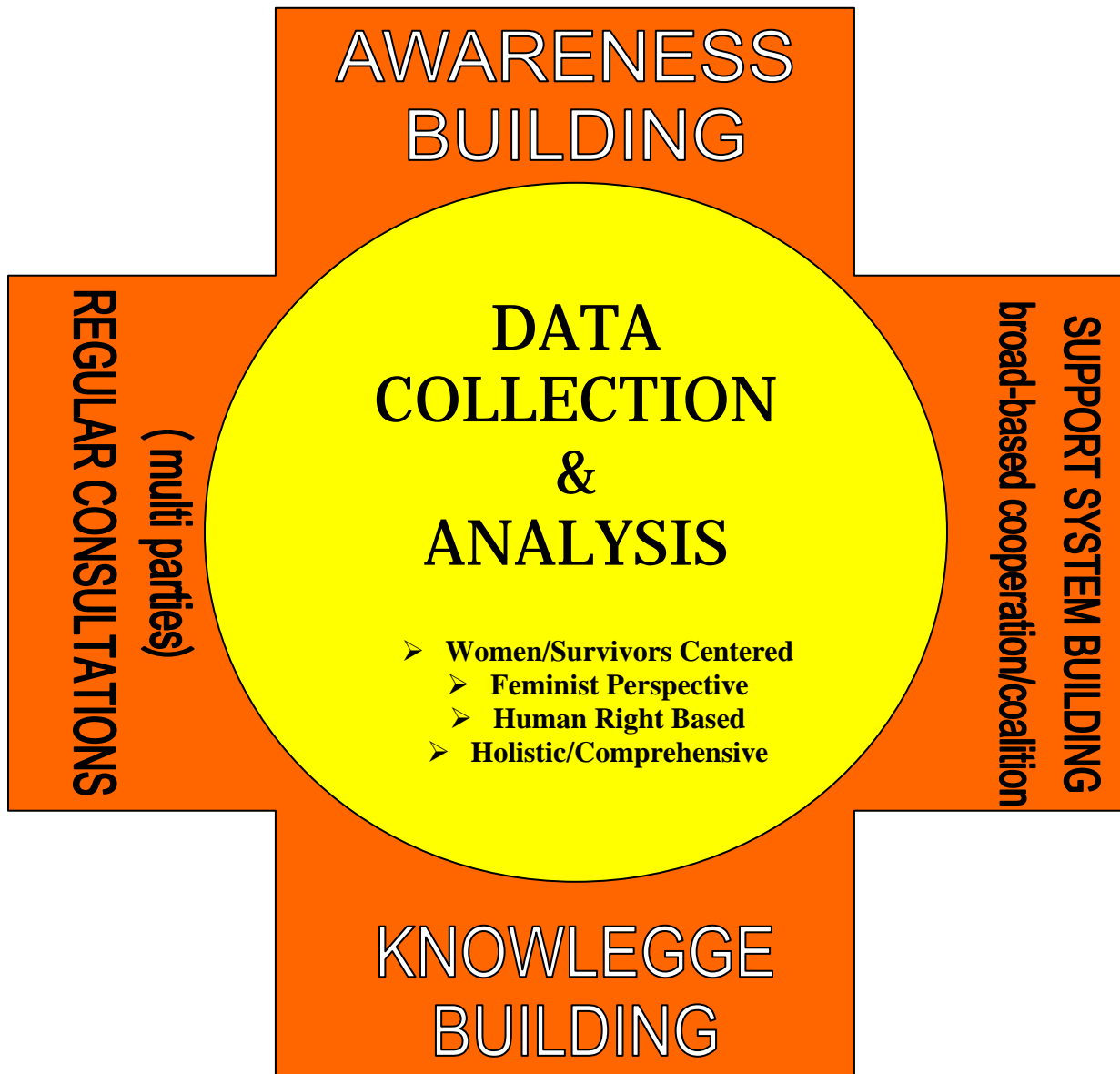

# SOME NOTES FROM THE FIELD

## **THE MOST NEEDED INFORMATION:**

### ➤ **Life Experience of The Victim/Survivor:**

- as woman, as wife, as mother, as citizen, as labour
- patriarchal values/system in daily life
- socio-economic situation
- the network of trafficking

### ➤ **Policies and Regulations**

- local, national, regional/international

### ➤ **Support Institutions** *(all about: mandat, vision, programmes, resources, mechanism, incl. their limitations)*

## **THE DILEMMA / THE TRAPP:**

- **Standardizing data**
- **Short term interest of victims/survivors**
- **Long term process of data analysis**
- **multifunction of the institutions** (governments institutions, media, religious institutions, NGOs, polices, married,...)

## NOTES:

∞ Ending impunity of human trafficker and providing justice to trafficked persons require effective mechanisms beyond states and across national borders.

∞ The forces which would be strong enough to compete with global trafficking networks require the combined energies of States, civil society and national human rights institutions in creating a synergic

global web of values, commitments, sanctions, incentives, information, and critical awareness.

☞ National human rights institutions play a critical role in the protection of the rights of migrant workers in the country of employment.

☞ To generate discussion on this, in 2006, Komnas Perempuan will be convening an international meeting of national human rights institutions from sending and receiving countries of Asia.

☞ Komnas Perempuan seeks the support of the Asia Pacific Forum on National Human Rights Commissions and its members in its effort to bring together, in 2006, NHRCs from Asian countries where women migrant workers are recruited and employed.

☞ It is hoped that this meeting would become one of the building blocks for the development of an effective regional

human rights mechanism to address all forms of human trafficking.
